

## Banners for First Holy Communion

It has been a tradition here at St. Mark that each communicant creates a communion banner with a Eucharistic theme. This banner will be hung on the end of a pew during Communion Mass.

Materials Needed to Make the Banner:

- Piece of felt (any color) -- 23 inches long and 18 inches wide (*can be purchased from Hancock Fabrics, Wal-Mart or any store that carries material*)
- Items to decorate banner such as foamie, sticky letters, felt, ribbon, gems etc.... (*Can be purchased from Michaels, AC Moore, other craft stores*)
- Hot glue gun or tacky glue

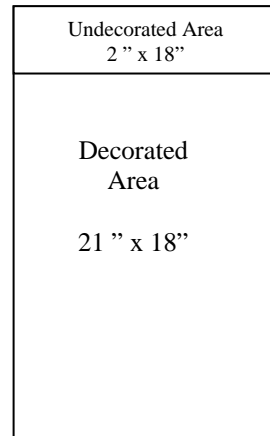
To Make Banner:

- Leave top 2 inches undecorated (*this part will be used to hang from pew*)
- Decorate banner with a Eucharistic theme using various colors of felt, foamie or ribbon (*no glitter, colored sand, wheat or anything that is messy please*).
- Rel. Ed. office will use the top 2 inches (undecorated) to hang the banner on the pew.

Length X Width of Felt Needed:      23 long x 18 inches wide

Undecorated top area:                    2 inches long x 18 inches wide

Decorated area:                            21 inches long x 18 inches wide
